



#39 Weather Seal

Put a few dabs of silicone sealer in T-slot before inserting the weather seal. We use Duro Clear Silicone Sealer. Make sure both sides of the backing are in the T-slots. Use the back edge of a blunt knife in the T-slot to get the plastic backing in the frame. Trim off the weather seal as needed to fit.

#39. weather seal is the longer haired. This weather seal has a solid gray line and a dotted gray line running down the back side of the weather seal. The goes on the bottom side of the panel.

#33. weather seal is the shortest This weather seal has one straight gray line running down the back side of the weather seal. This goes on the spine of the pet door panel. (back edge of panel next to frame). and on the top of the panel and the leading edge of the pet door panel.

*Note: Older panels have adhesive back weather seal on the spines. That has been discontinued. You will need to buy a new panel or purchase a new basic door...
